I would be very grateful if you could please send the below email out via any **Radyr community** social media sites you may use (not personal ones)

Dear Residents,

It has come to our attention that there is a homeless male frequenting Radyr. We have had a number of reports regarding concern for his welfare and also for concern of those who feel vulnerable due to his presence. In the last 72 hours the behaviour of this male has changed whereby he has become verbally abusive to local residents and has been arrested.

PCSO Laura Moore has had regular contact with the male and she has worked hard at getting assistance for him by liaising with outreach groups (homeless centre and Salvation Army).To date he has refused this assistance.

Whilst the act of human kindness has been understandably displayed by residents by providing food for this male, we are asking if people could refrain from this in the future . Some may feel it is against moral values, however we need to encourage this male back to the Cardiff city centre where there is the appropriate care and support for him .

By doing this we are working together as a community, assisting him in make the right decisions and removing the concerns that local residents have.

To report any further incidents regarding this male please call South Wales Police using 101. (This number generates recorded incidents so all officers can monitor the volume of reports. This does not happen if you call a specific officers number as they may not be on duty).
