



Coronavirus Care: local postcard initiative



Clearly, there is a limit to what a community council can do, but we want to do what we can.

As a first step, we decided to publish postcards to help people look after their neighbours if they're self-isolating. This, of course, was inspired by Becky Wass, who launched this initiative in her home town of Falmouth.

Our website

(www.radyrandmorganstown.org) and local social media explain where you can pick up a supply of our cards, to distribute to your neighbours. We want to keep this very local - so we are encouraging people to take no more than around 20 cards - and post them to people who live nearby. In this way, those who are self-isolating can be confident that they will be dealing with people they can trust.

Also, at the time of writing this, we are looking to set up a system to enable those who *haven't* received a card to let us know. Again, our website will explain how you can do so.

In the meantime, here's a picture of the postcard. We hope it will help put people in touch - and help ensure that anyone who has to selfisolate can get the help they need.



Memories of Radyr and Morganstown

My Grandfather, Constable Percy Jones of the Glamorgan Constabulary was the local Police Officer for a largely rural Radyr and Morganstown during World War II. He lived with my Grandmother, Elizabeth and their two young children including my father, Keith in the Police Station on Heol Isaf, Radyr near the Wesleyan Chapel (now Methodist Church). A young Rhodri Morgan, who went on to be First Minister of Wales, lived next door.

The outbreak of war in 1939 brought inevitable changes. A team of Special Constables were sworn in. The Chief Constable decreed that my Grandmother and other Constable's wives in "Cottage Stations" were not allowed to undertake any form of work, but help run the Police Stations and provide refreshments as necessary.

Child evacuees arrived from the big English cities because of the risk of aerial bombardment there. They were welcomed by, and stayed with local families. My father recalled a cricket match involving himself, Rhodri Morgan and evacuee children in a field at the rear of Windsor Road (where the houses of Plymouth Drive now stand). They were thought to be safer here, but sadly one young evacuee was killed by a train near the Gelynis Farm level crossing, Morganstown.

In 1943 the United States military built a hospital at nearby Rhydlafar to treat their casualties from continental Europe. The sight of friendly U.S. Military and their vehicles became common place. Local children who had never seen or tasted chewing gum before were encouraged to approach them and ask, "Any gum, Chum?" After the war, the hospital site was taken over by the NHS and became The Prince of Wales Orthopaedic Hospital. It is now a housing estate.

In March 1945, eighty German Prisoners of War tunnelled their way out of a Camp at Island Farm, Bridgend. Radyr and Morganstown's dozen or so farms were searched by Police and farm workers, but to no avail. Most of the escapees were recaptured, including a group who made it as far as Southampton.

Victory in Europe Day (VE Day) on 8th May 1945, was marked by a "Fancy Dress" Children's Parade. The photograph shows the procession passing the junction of Windsor Road and Drysgol Road, Radyr. My late father, Keith is shown wearing a trilby style hat in the centre of the photograph. Looking at their faces though, it does seem the wet Welsh weather dampened what would otherwise have been a joyous occasion.

In 1947, my Grandfather retired from the Police and the family moved to a house opposite, on the other side of Heol Isaf. Half way through moving their belongings they decided to take a break, sat down on their sofa in the middle of Heol Isaf and uninterrupted by any traffic, shared a pot of tea together.







From The Rectory

Dear Reader.

When I needed a neighbour were you there

Many years ago as a Girl Guide in the 1970s I was surprised to be invited to attend a world jamboree. They clearly didn't have many well behaved girls to choose from. Only weeks later the Chief Commissioner informed me that following my misbehaviour at a church parade I would not be going on the trip. I was punished for sitting behind a pillar with other guides chattering and giggling during what was a long and boring sermon and an archaic service!!! I often think of this when leading services where young people are present. When I became a Christian in my 20's, when I began training for ordination at 40 and when I became a Brown Owl in response to local need I dared to believe that God has a wicked sense of humour.

As a Guide there were three songs I loved to sing and at times like this they whirl around in my brain ...do you remember "Kum bay ya' with its haunting words -"someone's laughing Lord.....someone's crying Lordsomeone's praying Lord". We sat around camp fires singing and even now those simple lyrics help me. I felt comforted as we sang another childhood favourite, "He's got the whole world in his hands....he's got you and me baby in his hands". At monthly parade services the boredom was sometimes alleviated by the singing of "When I needed a neighbour were you there". Despite the tedious sermons this spoke to my heart, "I was hungry and thirsty were you there.....and the race and the colour and the creed won't matter were you there?"

As we travel towards Easter in a nation locked down by Coronavirus it's easy to believe we live in a Good Friday world when for the safety of each other we are being called to be good neighbours by keeping our distance. This all seems so unnatural - a Vicar who cannot preside over public worship in Radyr yet who will offer pastoral care by Skype, FaceTime, Email and phone to anyone who just needs support or comfort. We are all trying to reinvent ourselves and in the process maybe we will all discover what we most need and cherish.

Every biblical account of the first Easter tells us the tomb was empty yet soon after the friends of Jesus began to say "He is risen" because they realised that God's love could not be contained but is let loose in the world. Matthew's gospel story of the sheep and goats explains that we can see God's Christ present in every act of kindness or neighbourliness whether we know it or believe it.

Easter does not celebrate the normal cycle of life and death but the extraordinary truth that love never dies - God's love may be seen in every day life, at home, in hospital and in the community "and the race and the colour and the creed won't matter I'll be there"

I will be holding you all in my prayers this Lent, Holy Week and Easter,

Cyngor Cymuned Radur a Threforgan

I want to start by saying that I hope that Chain readers are keeping well - and that the precautions to combat the Coronavirus outbreak have kept you safe.

The news about the virus has been a priority for the Community Council. We met with some local volunteers and, with them, we published and distributed over 3,000 postcards (available in English and Welsh) to help people look after any self-isolating neighbours. We hope that the postcard can help put people in touch - and provide people with the help they need. So we wish everyone the very best - and we offer our thanks to those who are volunteering. We're a great community!

As ever, one of the main issues we have to deal with is managing the impact of road **traffic** flowing through our community. Work continues at the Heol Isaf / Llantrisant Road junction - and this, of course, will include replacing the roundabout with traffic lights.

We are also expecting contractors to be on site in June to begin installing three new **zebra crossings** on our main road (near Heol Syr Lewis, Ty Mynydd Close and Rectory Close). Hopefully, this work can continue - although the Coronavirus issue may lead to delays.

We await news from Cardiff Council with regard to an innovative scheme to combat HGV traffic passing through Radyr and Morganstown. A recent consultation proposing an amendment to the existing Weight Restriction Order caused some concern - since it included the entrance to the quarry in the exclusion zone (by mistake). This would have the unwanted effect of allowing quarry lorries to travel along our main road! Cardiff have assured us that this error will be rectified when the order is made. We also wait for news with regard to the proposed closure of Golf Club Lane.

We have consulted residents who live on or near **Station Road** about possible changes to the area. You can read more about this elsewhere in this Chain.

Also, with regard to Station Road, I'm afraid that we have heard nothing more about the old **Spar site**, which is becoming a bit of an eyesore. Unfortunately, this is not a good time to start a new business, so we may see the site empty for quite a while.

We continue to manage many of the open spaces across Radyr and Morganstown, including **Radyr Woods**. If you want to help, you can join the Radyr Woods Wardens' working parties. They would be delighted to welcome you. The dates are usually posted on our web site, the community web site - and the Radyr, Pentyrch and Morganstown - and Friends of Radyr Woods Facebook pages.

The project to refurbish the **children's play area** at Drover's Way has taken a step backwards. During the recent heavy rain, the manhole cover in the middle of the playground burst open, sending a small column of water skywards, which flowed across the playground for hours. It seems that the pipe entering the chamber under the manhole cover is much wider than the pipe which exits the chamber. This needs to be dealt with before the playground can be rebuilt. We were so close to finishing this work - but it's clearly important for the site to be safe.

Following the floods, we gave a contribution to our neighbours in Taffs Well to help them with their clean-up operation. This enabled them to buy brushes and other cleaning materials. We want to be good neighbours!

We welcomed our First Minister and local AM, Mark Drakeford, to our council meeting on 20 February. We questioned him about road safety, traffic, youth services and more.

We visited Bethel Chapel on 11 March, with local residents. The building is in a poor state - and the site is looking particularly unkempt. We aim to meet with the owner in the near future. We are also considering possible uses for

the site, were the owner to sell. More to follow on this!

We held another meeting of our **Youth Engagement Working Group** in March. A number of exiting projects are being developed, in liaison with the church, local police and school, to benefit our 12 to 17 year olds.

Our over 50's lunch club - held at the golf club twice a month - has been postponed for the duration of the Coronavirus outbreak. We hope that our postcards (see above) will help keep lunch club members in touch with the community. Similarly, many events normally held at the Old Church Rooms are being cancelled - so please check with the event organiser before you attend anything.

We continue to work to rebuild the wall between **Pentwyn Park** and the adjoining flats, following work to improve drainage of the footpath. We have a number of legal niceties to resolve.

Readers may remember that a byelection took place on 6 February, to fill
a vacancy in our Morganstown ward.
The successful candidate was **Allan Cook**. Allan has been a resident of the
Morganstown ward for more than thirty
years. He has been very active in Radyr
and Morganstown over that period,
having been Chair of the local History
Society for 25 years and a longstanding member of the Radyr and
Morganstown Association. We are
delighted to have Allan on the council and we are sure that he will make an
excellent contribution to our work!

The Future of the Station Road Area:

Community Council Consultation

The Station Road area is an important part of our community.

It's where we can go to shop, to eat, to spend time with friends and family, or to use the many services that are available there.

We want to ensure that this area thrives - and that the businesses located there can succeed (to benefit the wider community).

This area faces a number of pressures, however:

Its proximity to Radyr Station can make the area a convenient place for commuters to leave their cars, before catching a train to work.

In addition, the Plasdwr development may lead to an increase in the number of people using Radyr Station - adding to the number of commuters looking for somewhere to park for the day. This can cause parking difficulties for those who live in the area - and for those using Station Road's businesses.

With regard to road safety, the development of the Sidings - and the provision of additional parking spaces at Radyr Station - have not been accompanied by any alterations to the roads leading to and from those areas.

As Station Road comes under more pressure, in a community trying to deal with an increasing amount of traffic - as well as the growth of a 'new city' on its doorstep - we should do all that we can to enhance and protect this valuable community asset.

As we consider this, however, we need to balance the needs of those who live in this area with the needs of those who use our local businesses.

As such, following discussions with Cardiff Council, the Community Council's Road Safety Working Group developed ideas aimed at improving the area in and around Station Road.

During February we consulted with residents living on Station Road, Windsor Crescent, King's Road, King's Avenue and a small number of houses on Heol Isaf.

Rather than seeking general views, we decided to seek responses to specific options. Such as: should Station Road be one-way? Or should we introduce residents' parking on Windsor Crescent?

We distributed 150 copies of our survey, to the streets referred to above, including all of the residents of Cwrt Bryn Teg. 73 people completed our survey - and we had four responses via e-mail. We also received comments via our website. In addition, some comments were posted on local social media. We have sought to take all of these responses into account in our report.

Inevitably, the survey drew a strong and robust response! We welcome this - and find it useful that we now have some clear views about the merits, or otherwise, of our proposals.

The survey also led to respondents providing us with new ideas, alternative solutions - and fresh concerns about other road safety issues.

Here are the key results:

A majority of respondents (almost 57%) agree that the **Station Road area needs to be improved**. In general, a large majority of the comments we received referred to problems caused by the present situation - especially with regard to traffic, road safety and parking.

Notwithstanding the concerns about road safety, **making Station Road one-way** seemed to split opinions, with 44% in favour and 46% against. However, almost all the comments we received referred to the need to improve traffic-flow and road safety. As such, we feel that there is merit in making Station Road one-way along its entire length.

Making **Windsor Crescent** one-way was opposed by 61% of respondents. As such, we are happy to agree with the majority that this street should remain two-way.

A key issue raised by respondents was the danger presented by the **junction of King's Avenue and King's Road**. We think, therefore, that making King's Avenue one-way, (with traffic heading away from King's Road towards Station Road), could improve the safety of the junction. Alternatively, if the King's Avenue / King's Road junction can be made significantly safer (see below) then we would be content to agree with what seems to be the majority view - that the street should remain two-way.

Tabling junctions (such as the Heol Isaf / Station Road junction) received little support. For instance, 58% did not want the Heol Isaf / Station Road junction tabled - but the comments we received focused on wear & tear on vehicles, the expense of tabling and danger to pedestrians.

However, tabling has been shown to reduce accidents by around 44% - with motor vehicles likely to travel at around 13 mph over a speed-table. On balance, therefore, we feel that there is merit in considering further the suggestion that tabling should be installed at the Heol Isaf / Station Road junction - and at the King's Avenue / King's Road junction.

With regard to the section of **Station Road** which leads from Heol Isaf to its junction with Windsor Crescent, changing to a one-way road would provide an opportunity to create a better **balance**

between pedestrian and motorist use of the road. This could involve tabling, or some other design, which could promote the community focus of this area.

We felt sure that **parking** would be a contentious issue in our survey. The results confirmed our views - with many robust responses warning against making life more difficult for residents!

We found those responses to be very useful - especially one suggestion that we should look to develop the provision of restricted parking across the area - but with permits allowing residents to park without any of those restrictions applying to them. These are called **Controlled Parking Zones** - and they already operate in some parts of the UK. We would need to discuss this issue with Cardiff Council, along with the provision of permits for people visiting local residents, Station Road workers and tradesmen working in local homes.

Another issue that was mentioned frequently was the absence of **parking enforcement**. We agree that, whatever parking regime is in place, it should be enforced. Again, we would need to discuss this with Cardiff Council.

We would also need to ask Cardiff Council to consider the design of the King's Road / Heol Isaf junction with a view to making it safer - as well as providing safer ways for pedestrians to cross the roads as they approach Radyr Station. We may also ask for zebra crossings on Station Road and King's Road.

With regard to the **next steps**, we have sent our report on our consultation to the residents of Station Road, Windsor Crescent, King's Road and King's Avenue. Our intention, thereafter, would be to consult more widely, which would include a public meeting to discuss the possibilities.

At the end of the day, of course, any decisions with regard to this area will be matters for Cardiff Council to pursue.

Only Cardiff Council has the legal power, the money and the technical know-how to ensure that we can protect and develop Station Road.

Our role is to develop a vision for the area - and to work in partnership with Cardiff to deliver that vision, for the benefit of our community.

Joyce Morgan



Many in Radyr and Morganstown will remember Joyce Morgan. I got to know her when she came to support my mum Sylvia. Joyce was very capable and caring, and did everything with a smile. She was unique, she walked to most of her clients, she didn't drive. Joyce never talked about herself, so I had to learn more from her husband Gwyn. She was born in Llandovery in 1946 and from an early age wanted to become a nurse. She joined the local Red Cross, gaining several medals and winning her Stripes. After leaving school, Joyce was accepted at Gorseignon General Hospital, and later qualified as an S E N. She then joined St David's Hospital and worked in A & E for several years. During this time she met and married Gwyn and finally she left to have her daughters, Rachel in 1971 and Sian in 1973. While the girls were young, Joyce worked at Radyr Comprehensive, helping with the preparation of the school meals. Later she joined Social Services as a carer and worked for 25 years here, until she became very ill. After very difficult treatment and with Gwyn's support she seemed to recover, but a year later found her ill again. During this time, I made my Christmas visit and I was dismayed to see how very ill she was, but she still smiled all the time I was there. Gwyn told me she did so bravely, all through her illness. Soon after sadly, Joyce went to Home Towers and died in the February.

I will forever be in her debt; she did so much for my mum. Joyce will be remembered with affection by many in Radyr and Morganstown for bringing them her special brand of caring.







Spring Floods

Following two named weather fronts that dumped up to six inches of rain on our side of the Brecon Beacons which made it the wettest February on record, it was inevitable that the Taff should flood. On the whole we were lucky in Radyr and Morganstown only the lowest lying ground around the Cricket Club was underwater - see separate article. The Pentre Poeth area of Morganstown - around the Ynys Bridge roundabout - was not so lucky and many of the industrial units were flooded. One of these was the Royal Mail depot that services Radyr and Morganstown. If you have to collect your mail from the Sorting Office the Royal Mail will inform you of the nearest collection point.

The photographs show the aftermath of the floods, the Cricket Club and the hydro-electric generator at the weir being particularly affected.
