PACT Priorities

Station Road-Youth Annoyance

There have been 5 calls to the area relating to youths on a roof,2 motor cycle annoyance, Theft and 1 theft from the gardens

The police operation , FLEUR, is still ongoing and will continue throughout the summer (it is addressing youth annoyance in the whole of the rural area). Several Anti Social Behaviour letters have been issued to the local youths,Alcohol has been seized and disposed . Section 27 orders can be implemented which bans individuals for 48 hours from the area. .

Playing fields at Morganstown-ASB-

There have been no calls to the area, and no problems when officers have attended. It will be monitored over the Summer. A mobile police station will be randomly taken to the area to enable youth engagement.

The PACT chair will write a letter to the Radyr Chayne with regard to underage drinking and sale of alcohol.

Other Issues

Councillors update

Heol Isaf- Due to be resurfaced between the Tynant Inn and Real Radio. The double white lines will be replaced but should they go right onto the junction.

Railway Bridge Project-This is moving along very slowly, as the bridge is currently owned by Network Rail and needs to be handed over to the Council either by gift or lease. The Highways Department will be refurbishing the bridge in the next few weeks.

A **Neighbourhood Regeneration Fund** has been applied for and should be available in the 2012/2014 financial year.

Dog Bins-These are now in place in the village

A resident reported - That there seems to be an increase in the number of earth moving lorries in the area from both ends of the village .The Councillor will follow up and ensure they are within the 7.5 tonne regulations

Crime Statistics and Policing Update.- For the five weeks from 7th June to 14th July there have been 85 calls with 11 crimes and 5 arrests of which 24 are related to Anti Social Behaviour. The main problem area has been Heol Isaf.. There has been a spate of theft from motor vehicles in the Cardiff area. Can residents be reminded about securing their vehicle and not leaving any property on display.

Theft of metal has increased and can any suspicious persons please be reported to 101 with the vehicle registration number, what it was carrying and the times it was seen. A joint operation is planned in August in conjunction with Trading Standards.

New Issues

Radyr Golf Club.

Concerns were raised about the vandalism which occurred on the practise green where youths carved CFS onto the grass

The Local Development Plan may infringe on to the golf course so residents should be aware and make comment. This process closes in October 2011.

Fisher Hill Way- There has been groups of older youths in the children play area, there is some graffiti under the baby slide which is not very nice. There has also been youths drinking in the park and dogs have been allowed in the same area, left to do their own business. In the local area ,there has been an increase of litter in the area ,most of it from the local school. The Councillor will speak to the school authorities before the beginning of next term.
