Radyr and Morganstown

Metro is all about making it easier to travel, whether you're travelling by train, bus, bike or on foot. It'll make it easier to get to work or school, to get to your hospital appointment or to get out and about in the evening and weekends using public transport.

We're currently working on Metro in your area. The latest phase of our project, which began earlier in August 2020 on the Treherbert, Aberdare and Merthyr railway lines, upwards from Radyr Station, includes:

- Preparation work to the track, in order for us to later electrify and modernise it
- removing overgrown vegetation alongside the existing railway corridor

Later, we will install the overhead posts and wires, as well as modify bridges, level crossings and signalling equipment. There's a substantial programme of work required, but we are keen to keep you informed.

Our lineside neighbours

You'll see our people working on the railway late evening and overnight because our work either on, or very close to our railway lines can only be undertaken safely when trains aren't running.

In order to access the railway to undertake our work, we will be setting up suitable access and temporary site compounds at – and near to - Radyr Station.

Alongside our partners, we'll ensure our sites are well managed and that our people are considerate. Engineering work can be noisy, so we'll work closely with local communities and businesses to explain what we're doing and find ways to try and keep disruption to a minimum.

The amount of work we must do means it won't be possible to write to you every time we're working in your area, but we'll keep you up to date by sharing details of our work on our website.



Planning your travel

You may be aware that, at present, the railway north of Radyr station is closed from 8pm, with bus replacement services in operation. This is so our teams can begin work for the evening and continue to work through the night. Radyr station will act as the main inter-change hub between rail and bus services, with buses replacing rail services. The normal train timetable will continue to run between Cardiff Central and Radyr until close of service, with early morning train services running as usual.

Customer service teams will be on hand at Radyr station to direct customers to and from the interchange hub situated in the adjacent car park. Road transport has been arranged to link in with train services to keep waiting times to a minimum.


